



Seasonal Nurse Truck Driver Position

Description

Seasonal Nurse Truck Drivers will be delivering liquid fertilizer to applicators in the fields. They will be required to comply with and be knowledgeable about the following areas of responsibility.

Responsibilities

- Conduct a pre-trip inspection of the truck they are driving in the morning and post-trip inspection at the end of the day. Complete the form and keep a copy in the truck. Bring any mechanical or safety problems to the attention of the retail manager.
- Assist in loading the truck with fertilizer and /or pesticides and take a copy of the work order/load ticket to the field. Assist the custom applicator at the field with transferring product from the nurse truck to the applicator. Be careful to minimize and contain any spillage in these processes.
- Operate the truck in a safe manner and comply with all traffic laws. Be careful not to put the truck in a dangerous situation while entering and leaving field locations, remembering that loads can shift quickly causing a truck to overturn and cause a spill or injury.
- In the event of a spill of fertilizer and/or pesticides from the nurse truck, know how to contain the spill using personal protective equipment and other resources made available by the retail location.
- Keep the truck clean, inside and out, by throwing away trash, washing windows, rinsing off fertilizer and pesticide residues either in the field or on a load pad.
- Each driver will be included in the Twin State random drug testing pool.
- Drivers should be able to read a plat book and follow directions so that loads are delivered to the correct fields for application.

Requirements

- Must be 18 years or older
- Have a Class B CDL
- Good driving record
- Available for a flexible work schedule and overtime
- Pre-employment drug testing is required
